## **To Preserve the Past and Protect the Future.**

- **Janice and I live on Old Sutton Road with the Forest Preserve as our back yard.** I have two children and great grandchildren. We hike the Forest Preserve trails with our Corgi and neighbors all year long, and we're often visited by friends and neighbors on horseback. We love our home. We love our community.
- **We know that we can't take our way of life for granted.** Greedy developers are eager to break our zoning and erode our borders. And the pressure never abates.
- **For the past eight years, I've been a trustee of the Village.** As trustee, I've served as Chair of Buildings and Grounds, Road Commissioner and, for the past six years, Chair of the Police Department. And for eight years, I've never wavered in my support for 5-acre zoning and protecting our borders. *I am the only incumbent seeking a four-year term.*
- **Our community has a unique living environment that must be preserved.** Here are my positions on four major issues I see as key to achieving this goal:
  1. **Preserve (R-I) Zoning.** This is paramount for maintaining open space and minimizing housing density, which will protect surface and well water supply, wildlife, air quality and more. 5-acre zoning is core to preserving what our founders started over 50 years ago.
  2. **Fight De-Annexation of Village Property.** This will keep our borders from shrinking, our area intact and our zoning laws stronger. Remember that 40% of our Village land mass is open space.
  3. **Village Border Agreements.** Border agreements should be negotiated between our village and neighboring towns and villages to control development, strengthen our borders and improve working relationships with surrounding governments.
  4. **Equestrian Trail System.** Our private riding trails combine with Forest Preserve bridal paths to link one end of our village to the other. Our trails are our lifeline and define our village as a rural, equestrian community, which is our central justification for 5-acre zoning.
